RESTRICTIONS TO CURBSIDE PARKING AND DRIVEWAY ACCESS

Clove Road Archaeological Dig Project Set To Commence

Clove Road between Montgomery Street and Malbone Street

TEST PITS ACTIVITIES
On/About Monday, March 21, 2011
Mondays through Fridays —7:00am to 6:00pm

Beginning on/about Monday, March 21, 2011, the NYC Department of Design and Construction (NYCDDC) will perform test pits activities in association with the Clove Road Archaeological Dig Project. This work will occur on Clove Road between Montgomery Street and Malbone Street and is expected to continue for approximately two (2) weeks. During this time, curbside parking and driveway access will be restricted within the vicinity of the excavation sites.

WHY IS THIS WORK BEING PERFORMED?

An archeological study performed in 2002 reported that this area is sensitive to two eras in history: the Revolutionary War period and the 2nd quarter of the 19th Century and may contain archaeological artifacts. These tests pits are being excavated to determine the presence or absence of possible artifacts. Approximately four (4) test pits, under the direct supervision of an archeologist will be excavated.

WHAT ARE THE COMMUNITY IMPACTS?

During construction hours, there will be No Thru Traffic allowed on Clove Road between Montgomery and Malbone Streets; local and emergency traffic will be allowed. Clove Road will be reopened at the end of the work day. Please be advised of the following traffic and pedestrian impacts:

- ❖ **Local Traffic/Emergency Access** –one lane will be maintained at all times during work hours. **Flag Personnel will accommodate traffic flow.**
- ❖ **Parking** –curbside parking will be temporarily restricted so construction may proceed.
 - **Signs will be posted where necessary.**
- ❖ **Pedestrian Access** -will be maintained at all times.

PLEASE CONTINUE ON OTHER SIDE →

Pedestrian/Traffic

- ❖ **Driveway/Loading Dock Access**-may be temporarily restricted. However, the DDC will coordinate with business owners to ensure access to loading docks.

Student Pick-Up/Drop Off

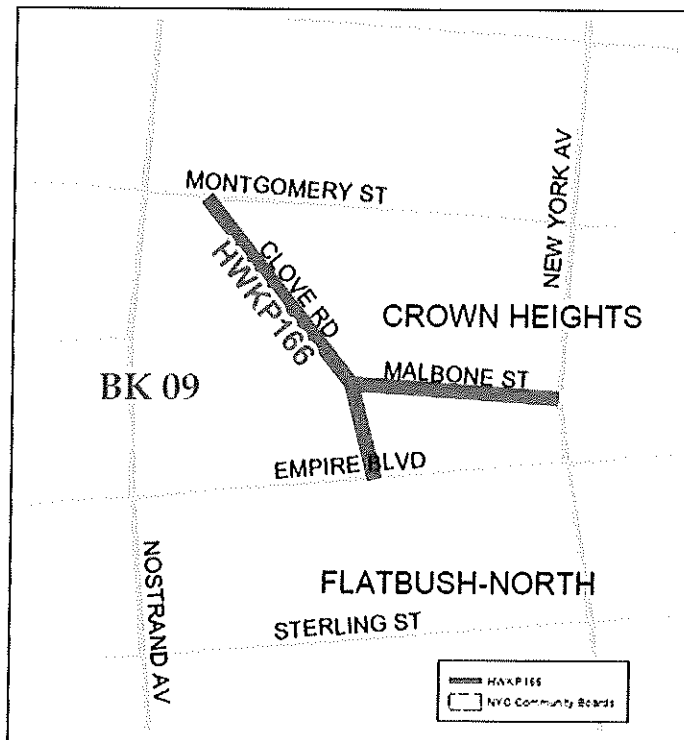
- ❖ Where construction impacts school pick-up and drop-off areas, the DDC will coordinate with the DOE and school officials to ensure these locations are safe, clearly marked and maintained.

WHAT ARE THE HOURS OF WORK?

The contractor's allowable working hours are Monday-Friday, between the hours of 7:00AM-6:00 PM. However, typical work days are between the hours of 7:00AM-4:00PM.
